The November 2016 Bond Program identified capital construction improvements to construct a new Red Canyon High School Spring Creek Campus that were based upon priorities established within the Eagle County Schools Facilities Master Plan. The team of Haselden Construction \ DLR Group \ TAB Architects was selected in November 2016 to act as Design Builder to develop the formal construction scope of work, secure proposals, and manage the construction of the improvements using a Design Build Cost Plus Guaranteed Maximum Price contract. The project architect (DLR Group / Tab Architects) held multiple user group meetings to develop schematic designs and design development for the improvements which were completed and reviewed by the facility teams. The project scope has been solicited for bidding by Haselden Construction and a formal Guaranteed Maximum Price proposal has been prepared for approval by the Board of Education. The project scope is consistent with the improvements identified in the Bond and the proposal is within the budget established for the building program. The Board of Education previously authorized Bid Package #1 for site development, concrete, utilities, and securing long lead items critical to the schedule in the amount of \$2,857,304.

**This Bid Package #2 Limited Scope of Work and Guaranteed Maximum Proposal represents the balance of all necessary labor, materials, and equipment to construct the project as described in the May 17, 2018 proposal presented by Haselden Construction / DLR Group / TAB Architects. The amount of this proposal is \$2,529,553 for a total project cost of \$5,386,857.**

A major responsibility of the District Advisory Council and Board of Education is to collaborate with community providers to allocate Colorado Preschool Program (CPP) slots to provide families more choice. For this process we develop and issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) to the community (4.09 CCR). School districts are required to send out RFPs at least once every two years to assess whether alternative community providers are available.

A Request for Proposal was sent out to all licensed providers in Eagle County in March 2018. One proposal was received from Family Learning Center. Family Learning Center has provided services to CPP families since 2011.

The proposals were reviewed by CPP Advisory Board on 5-7-2018 and they recommended Family Learning Center be presented to the Board of Education for approval as the contracted provider for Colorado Preschool Program Slots. The recommendation is as follows:

Family Learning Center will be allocated 32 ECARE slots to serve 16 children in two classrooms to assure blended programming.
