Sandy Mutchler, COO and Chris Delsordo, Director of Nutrition Services

Eagle County Schools is in need of updating Nutritional Services Software. The software allows us to manage point of service, student eligibility, application scanning, inventory, menu planning, production and team work.

This is a compressive program that allows all modules to integrate information, calculating cost per meals and labor, and provides accounting transparency.

The Colorado Department of Revenue is supportive of this system and allows us to export claim information directly from the system to CDE's system.

Upgrading systems will provide an increased level of accountability, auditing and supervision over operations.

Student and parent use will become user friendly allowing parents to apply for free and reduced within the system. Nutritional analysis is available on menu items for students, parents and nurses enabling dietary needs to be met.

The initial cost of the software, installation, training and equipment is a total of \$ \$53,470. The expenditure will be accounted for in the Nutrition Services Fund. The fund balance is sufficient to support this software and will allow us to operate more efficiently and save operational dollars over time.

Contract is included for your reference and any revisions including Colorado Addendum will be included in the final agreement.

Eagle County Schools and the Vail Recreation District "VRD" entered into an MOU on July 1, 2011 for use of school facilities. There is a need to update some of the terms.

Main components of the revisions include:

- Reference specifically to Homestake Peak vs. the old Battle Mountain.
- School facility use includes in conjunction with YP365.
- Calendar notification dates have been moved from September to August for planning purposes.
- Added a five year term.

- Provides for a \$2,400 annual rental fee from VRD to ECS.
- Maintenance responsibilities are outlined more clearly.

On June 1, 2016 the Board of Education approved a Trail Easement at Red Mountain Ranch. Main elements of the easement include:

- 20' in width over the length of the property (roughly 2 acres total)
- County to provide easements from BLM and CDOT (for benefit of ECS) to provide room sufficient to accommodate future road construction to the parcel
- Eagle County provided payment of \$100,000 to ECS prior to trail construction.
- ECS to have review authority over trail improvements.
- If by December 31, 2018 the County has not obtained BLM or CDOT approvals, ECS may get release of easement.

This Quitclaim deed provides access to the trail by the Colorado Department of Transportation and is necessary to complete the trail easement.

Eagle County Schools and the Town of Vail have been collaborating to build a parking structure adjacent to Red Sandstone Elementary School. The parties entered into a Development IGA dated August 15, 2017. An initial lease Lease on April 12, 2006, followed by an Amendment on May 1, 2018 is also in effect.

This Operations Agreement defines the operational use of the parking structure. Main components of the Operational Agreement include:

- The structure is owned and operated by the Town with financial contribution by the District and the Vail Reinvestment Authority.
- Of the 160 total parking spaces in the Structure, 40 parking spaces on the upper level will be restricted for exclusive use by the District during the defined School Year (the "Restricted Spaces"), provided that there shall be no parking on the upper level between 11:00 p.m. and 6:30 a.m.
- The Town shall provide the District with parking passes for use of the Restricted Spaces, and the District will control the distribution of its parking passes and is responsible for the replacement cost of lost or damaged passes.
- At the conclusion of each School Year, and until the start of the next School Year, the Restricted Spaces will be returned to the Town for public use.
- The Structure shall not be expanded without the prior written consent of the District.
- The Town shall maintain and operate the Structure with cost contributions by the District. In the first year of this Agreement, beginning on the Effective Date, the District is responsible for 13.017%. The formula is included in the Operational Agreement for your reference.
- In addition to contributing a share of Operations and Maintenance Costs, the District shall contribute 13.017% to capital maintenance items determined by the Parties to be necessary for the Structure (the "Capital Costs Contribution"). In the first year of this Agreement, beginning on the Effective Date, the District is responsible for \$0 in Capital Costs Contribution.
- The Town and the District shall meet annually to establish the Capital Costs Contribution for the upcoming year and shall maintain an agreed-upon list of capital maintenance items to be completed within the next year, 5 years and 10 years.

1. Eagle County Schools believes that school districts have an obligation to ensure they are properly prepared for unforeseen and potentially catastrophic situations that could arise.
2. All Principals have been or will be National Incident Management System certified and understand the importance of proper incidence response. Administrators will continue to drill with agencies and offer access to schools for community trainings. Such trainings include: SWAT, Medical, Community Issues, Interstate drills, and Wildfire Command.
3. Philip Qualman and Tammy Schiff continue to work with County agencies and participate in community simulations to work through logistics in crisis situations.
4. The district continues its process to improve school safety through enhanced drilling and tabletop exercises. School resource officers assist with drills and tabletop scenarios at the school building level.
6. Most schools are now equipped with mechanical and technological improvements with funds from the 2016 Bond initiative that provide secure entry vestibules, electronic door access, and increased security camera coverage.
7. We continue to evaluate and examine technologically based visitor management systems for schools as pricing and technology continues to improve making these programs viable for the District.
